

BIOGRAPHY OF HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCE SEBASTIEN OF LUXEMBOURG

His Royal Highness Prince Sébastien Henri Marie Guillaume, Prince of Luxembourg, Prince of Nassau and of Bourbon-Parma, was born at the Maternité Grande-Duchesse Charlotte in Luxembourg on April 16th 1992.

He is the fifth and youngest child of Their Royal Highnesses the Grand Duke and Grand Duchess of Luxembourg. He is the brother of Prince Guillaume (born in 1981), current Hereditary Grand Duke, Prince Félix (1984), Prince Louis (1986) and Princess Alexandra (1991).

In 2010, Prince Sébastien received the Order of the "*Lion d'Or*" of the House of Nassau.

STUDIES

After attending nursery school in Angelsberg, Luxembourg, Prince Sébastien enters *St. George's International School* for his primary education. He then goes to the United Kingdom where he attends *Sunningdale School* and *Ampleforth College*, before completing his secondary education with an International Baccalaureate at the *International School of Luxembourg*.

Prince Sébastien then enrolls in the *Franciscan University of Steubenville*, USA, where he completes his studies with a Bachelor of Science in Marketing and Communication, in December 2015.

At the moment, His Royal Highness Prince Sébastien receives an Officer training at the Royal Military Academy in Sandhurst, UK.

OFFICIAL ACTIVITIES

Whenever his schedule permits, Prince Sébastien takes part in the official activities of the Grand Ducal Family, attending events or ceremonies.

PATRONAGE

Dedicated to upholding the values promoted through sports, Prince Sébastien holds the High Patronage of the *Fédération luxembourgeoise de natation et de sauvetage* (Luxembourg Federation of Swimming and Lifesaving).

LEISURE ACTIVITIES

Prince Sébastien is a keen sportsman and enjoys climbing, skiing, swimming and particularly rugby. After proudly wearing the colours of his club for several years, he was selected for the Luxembourg national rugby team. Curious by nature, Prince Sébastien enjoys discovering new cultures.
